FAQ

Where is the Marathon taking place?

In multiple areas throughout the Museum and the Seamen's Bethel across the street (Johnny Cake Hill). The timing is detailed in this program.

Can I get a seat in the Seamen's Bethel?

If you did not sign up for the drawing for a seat, you can still see Father Mapple's sermon via livestream in the Harbor View Gallery (Upper Level).

Can I come and go?

Yes, you may enter and exit through the Museum's main entrance as you please.

If I haven't signed up, can I still read?

Reading spots have all been assigned. However, you can sign up at the reader log-in table to be a "stand-by" reader.

Is there food and drink available?

Yes, food and beverages will be available for purchase in Whales Today (Lower Level) throughout the weekend.
